# It's A Hurricane!

The 2007 Atlantic Hurricane Season is upon us. The official start is June 1, and will last until November 30, 2007.



On December 8, 2006 forecasters gave their first extended-range forecast for the 2007 season, predicting above-average activity (14 named storms, 7 hurricanes, 3 category 3 or higher).

On April 3, a new forecast was issued, calling for a very active hurricane season of 17 named storms, 9 hurricanes and 5 intense hurricanes. The increase in the forecast was attributed to the rapid dissipation of El Nino. The potential for at least one major hurricane impacting the U.S. was increased from 64% to 74%.

## What Can You Do?

### PREPARE!

Preparedness is the key during hurricane season. Consider the following before a storm threatens the area.

- ➔ Make sure your vehicles are filled with gas.
- ➔ Get cash, including a roll of quarters.
- ➔ Make sure prescriptions are filled and you have enough medicine to last a week.
- ➔ Make sure cell phones are fully charged.
- ➔ Fill all propane tanks.
- ➔ Set your refrigerators and freezer to the coldest setting.
- ➔ Fill sinks and bathtubs to provide a supply of water.

Now is a good time to assemble a disaster supply kit including the following items: First-aid kit, non-perishable foods and a can opener, battery-powered radio, flashlight, and extra batteries, lighter, matches and candles.

This is also a great time to re-familiarize yourself with your home/work hurricane preparedness plan.

## Ecumenism



The word ecumenism is derived from Greek (oikoumene), which means “the inhabited world.” The word is used predominantly by and with reference to Christian Churches and denominations separated by doctrine, history and practice.

In its broadest meaning, ecumenism refers to initiatives aimed at worldwide religious unity. It advocates a greater shared spirituality across Christian, Jewish and Islamic faiths.

In a narrower and more common sense, ecumenism refers to the movement towards co-operation among and better understanding between religious groups or denominations, without aiming at unity.

When Jewish believers heard that Gentiles had accepted the word of God, their first reaction was not acceptance. After understanding God’s view, they better understood the call to unity. Just as Gentiles and Jews in the early church had to learn how to get along with one another and work together to advance the Kingdom, we have a similar challenge today when we look out at the landscape of divided religious groups.

Will we dare to ask God to use us as instruments of unity among his people, our brothers and sisters? Can we place love and mutual respect above all else?

We should all look forward to the day when God will bring all religions closer together. In the meantime, we should all cooperate with our fellow believers wherever and whenever we can. Who among us knows what God can do if we allow his spirit the opportunity to work in us?
